2024 Summer Term Curriculum Letter for Palmer Class

Welcome to the Summer Term at Shoreham Village School.

We hope you have all had a lovely Easter break. A copy of the curriculum map for this term is attached for your information. PE will be on a Monday afternoon and swimming will be on a Friday afternoon. Please make sure that you children comes to school in their PE kits on those days. On swimming days, please ensure your child brings a named costume and towel in a separate bag. The children will change into their costumes at school before swimming. Please do not send them in the morning wearing costumes as it can be tricky for them to use the toilet during the day.

We ask that reading records be handed into school each day so that they can be used as a means of communication with your child's class teacher. It is important that you read with your child every day. They will be sent home with a reading book, which they should read at least three times for fluency, as well as a reading for pleasure book to be shared with parents. Please note when they have read in the reading records. When a child has read 100 times with accompanying signatures, they will be awarded a book of their choice. Homework will be set on the school website under Palmer Class on a **Friday** and collected in on a Wednesday. It may not always be possible for your child to complete all of the homework set, but please encourage them to finish what they are capable of, and then spend some time reading **every day**. Maths homework will now be a video and an online maths sheet, which would have been taught previously in the week. Please begin by showing your child the video and then completing the sheet as directed in the video. It is important that the children get into a routine of reading instructions and questions for themselves and to have a good attempt at the work set.

Please ensure your child brings a named water bottle to school that they take home daily to be washed and refilled and that all personal clothing and items are labelled.

Please be on the lookout for letters, parent mail and information on the website informing you of events taking place. We are confident that your child will have a happy, productive and enjoyable term but should you wish to discuss any aspects of their experiences at our school, please do not hesitate to pop in and discuss them with us, preferably after school, or make an appointment through the School Office.
