Prime Areas

The following prime areas underpin our learning in Reception and support the learning in the specific areas:

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

- Continue to follow class rules
- Play cooperatively in groups
- Take turns and share resources with and without adult support
- Invite other children to play
- Be aware of own feelings and the feelings of others
- Can adapt behaviour to different events and social situations
- Aware of boundaries and behaviour expectations in class, dinner hall and playground

Communication and Language

- Sit, listen and concentrate for short periods of time; focussing on the person who is speaking
- Develop and extend language through imaginative play and storytelling
- Speak using full sentences
- Stick to a main topic or theme when talking
- Begin to follow two-step instructions
- Question why things happen and give an explanation

Physical Development

- Use and hold pencil with a firm grip
- Begin to form letters in cursive when markmaking and writing
- Show awareness of safety rules when using equipment
- Show an awareness of other children's personal space
- Yoga and mindfulness
- Running the 1k a day
- Continue to be dry and clean
- Dress and undress independently
- Healthy eating

Specific areas

The following specific areas include essential skills and knowledge for the children to participate successfully in society:

<u>Literacy</u>

- Phonics Phase 1
- Enjoy sharing books with friends and independently
- Hear, say and write sounds accurately
- Begin to read some simple words
- Write with a purpose eg: label a picture or artwork
- Give meaning to the marks they make

Mathematics

- Recognise numerals 1 to 10
- Count to 10 and beyond
- Count down from 10
- Count actions and objects that cannot be moved
- Count two sets to find the total
- Subitising
- Use familiar objects and common shapes to create and recreate patterns and build models
- Order items by weight
- Use vocabulary such as 'big', 'small', 'largest', 'smallest', 'heaviest' and 'lightest'.

Understanding the World

- Festivals How do people celebrate Diwali and Christmas?
- Using a drawing programme on the ipad or computer to create a Diwali firework picture
- How do you celebrate Guy Fawkes night?
- How can we keep safe during Fireworks? What can we do to keep our animals safe?
- Show how your construction creations work? Ask how and why

Expressive Arts and Design

- Christmas assembly
- Build stories around Percy the Park keeper
- Choose particular colours for a purpose and explain why
- Act out narratives based on stories they know
- Construct with a purpose in mind
