## Year 2024: Spring Term 1st Half Curriculum Letter

Welcome to the first half of the Spring Term at Shoreham Village School!

A copy of the curriculum map for this term is attached for your information, along with a homework timetable. The children will have PE sessions on a Monday and Friday and will need to come to school in their PE kits on those days. The children have a homework book in which a weekly homework note will be stuck in and the date it is due in. It may not always be possible for your child to complete all of the homework set. Please encourage your child to finish what they are capable of, and then spend some time reading for 10 to 20 minutes each day, revising and practising their times tables. It is important that the children get into a routine of reading instructions and questions for themselves, and to have a good attempt at the work set. A relaxed discussion with your child about work they are stuck on can often be beneficial, providing your child does not feel under pressure. They can log on to their LEXIA and Mathletics programs at home as well which will also encourage them to work on their literacy and maths skills.

Please also help your child to be prepared for lessons by providing them with a named water bottle, which is to be taken home every night to wash and refill.

The Spring Term is an exciting one with a variety of activities on offer so please refer to the Spring Term Calendar, which is available on the school website, and be on the lookout for Parentmail communications and Newsletters informing you of events taking place. We are confident that your child will have a happy, productive and enjoyable term but should you wish to discuss any aspect of their experiences at school, please do not hesitate to pop in and discuss them with the class teacher or make an appointment through the school office.
